ATTENDANCE:	Thomas E. Mincer, Chairman; Dennis L. Brink, Vice Chairman; Edward D. Nikles, Supervisor; Karen Kleist, Secretary/Treasurer; John H. Klemeyer, Solicitor; and Chris Wood, Sewage/Zoning Enforcement Officer. Present remotely: Mark O'Brien; and Cory Conant.
ITEM NO. 1: CALL TO ORDER	Chairman Mincer called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm opening with the Pledge of Allegiance.
ITEM ND. 2: APPROVAL OF MINUTES	MOTION was made by Ed Nikles, seconded by Dennis Brink, and unanimously carried to approve the September 15, 2020 and October 6, 2020 Minutes and presented.
ITEM ND. 3: Covid-19 related business	Dingman Township was awarded \$84,031 from the County Covid-19 Relief grant. Checks should be sent out shortly.
ITEM NO. 4: OLD BUSINESS A) PMWL School Bus Stop Project	Karen Kleist reported that she received the Bond late this afternoon after the Agenda was completed.
ITEM ND. 4(B): Garage Project	Karen Kleist reported that ten companies came to the required pre-bid meeting last week; bids are due October 30 <sup>th</sup> , and they will be publicly opened. The Engineer should have an evaluation to the Board for the next meeting. The loan ordinance is also scheduled for adoption at the next meeting.
ITEM ND. 4(C): Election Day Preparedness	Supervisor Nikles raised concern that the polls will probably have the very high turnout that we saw a couple elections ago where people were lined up down the road even after dark. Lighting and traffic control may be issues. Karen Kleist stated that she raised the need for traffic control to the Board of Elections a few weeks ago and they were going to make arrangements. The Firehouse had one light unit: Mark O'Brien stated the county has those units and he will request one additional for the firehouse and one for the Foxcroft/SR2001 intersection. If lights are not available from the County, the Township will see if any of the rental places have some available.
ITEM ND. 4(D): Other Old Business	Karen Kleist reported that the temporary closure of Rt. 739 has been rescheduled for Friday October 23 <sup>rd</sup> at 4:30 pm to Monday the 26 <sup>th</sup> by 6:00 am. The detour is Log Tavern Road/Sr2002.
ITEM ND. 5: NEW BUSINESS A) 2021 Kenworth Dump pricing	Shane Williams received quote from MJR Equipment for a 2021 Kenworth Dump equivalent to the Peterbilt (which we are still waiting for a price for upfitting). The Kenworth chassis is \$112,853, upfitting is \$75,647, and trade value of International is \$10,000 for a net cost of \$179,700 including freight. The Peterbilt chassis was \$105,975. The Board want to evaluate full specs and pricing on both vehicles.
ITEM ND. 5(B): Other New Business	There was no Other New Business at this time.
ITEM ND. 6: CORRESPONDENCE A) Disabled Veterans Tax Exemption	The Board received notification from the Department of Veterans Affairs that the following new applicants qualify for property tax exemptions: James Henry, effective June 1, 2020 and Walter Garbrecht, effective July 30, 2020. MOTION was made by Ed Nikles, seconded by Dennis Brink, and unanimously carried to approve the Disabled Veteran property tax exemptions for James Henry and Walter Garbrecht.
ITEM ND. 6(B): Pike County Tax Administration	The Board received notification of a Request for Additional Assessment representing 2020 taxes for a property bought from the County Repository. The Board had no objections.
ITEM ND. G(C): Miscellaneous Correspondence	The Board reviewed various Miscellaneous Correspondence and had no comments.

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ITEM ND. 7: Emergency services reports	DTVFD Chief Mark D'Brien reported that hose and pump testing for recertification had started. The ladder truck is out of service for repairs.
ITEM ND. 8: Roadmaster Report	MOTION was made by Dennis Brink, seconded by Ed Nikles, and unanimously carried to approve the October 5-19, 2020 Roadmaster report as submitted.
ITEM ND. 9: Sewage / Zoning Officer Report	Chris Wood informed the Board that our current Alternate SED will not be available after the end of this year. The Board asked him to check with Ron Tussel to see if he would be interested.
item ND. 10: Treasurer's Report	MOTION was made by Dennis Brink, seconded by Ed Nikles, and unanimously carried to approve the October 20, 2020 Treasurer's Report, Bill Payment List, and General Fund balance, and to sign the checks following the meeting.
ITEM ND. 11: PUBLIC COMMENT	There were no comments from the public.
EXECUTIVE SESSION:	Chairman Mincer stated that the Board conducted an interview just prior to the meeting for an Alternate Snow Plow Operator opening, and would be recessing to Executive Session at this time to discuss.
